

BASL BVHG Chair Role Description

Membership

The BASL British Viral Hepatitis Group (BVHG) Chair shall be elected by the Membership and the post holder can serve for up to three years and may be re-elected once.

The successful applicant will be expected to attend and contribute to 1 face-to-face and 3 web-based committee meetings each year and to the work of the committee for BASL.

The BVHG Chair will be registered at Companies House in the UK as a Director of BASL and registered with the Charities Commission as a Trustee.

Roles and responsibilities

- 1. To work closely with the BASL committee to ensure that UK viral hepatitis is well represented both nationally and internationally.
- 2. To work closely with international organisations such as EASL and WHO to ensure the highest standards of care and to ensure there is alignment of treatment and management recommendations.
- 3. The BVHG Chair also has responsibility in terms of teaching, education and the dissemination of the latest developments in the field of viral hepatitis through regular meetings, the Chair is responsible for organising the meetings and inviting speakers and delegates.
- 4. The Chair of the BVHG is also a key member of various policy committees including the national strategic group on viral hepatitis (NSGVH) and works closely with UKHSA and the Department of Health to improve case finding, management pathways for people living with viral hepatitis and equity of access to clinical trials.
